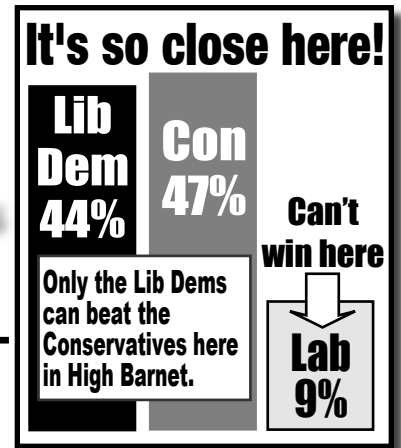

Lib Dems pledge to restore sheltered warden service

VULNERABLE older residents living in sheltered housing have been forced to take Barnet Council to court to fight the scrapping of their on-site warden service.

Says Cllr Duncan Macdonald:

"Whatever ultimately happens in court, the Liberal Democrats in Barnet will continue to campaign for this heartless policy to be reversed."

There are wardens in High Barnet and throughout the borough who are there for emergencies, to manage social activities, and to provide residents with information about the benefits they are entitled to.

Adds Duncan: "Last April the Liberal Democrat group on Barnet Council proposed an alternative budget that protected the site-based warden service. Sadly, the Tories threw it out. A Lib Dem-controlled Barnet Council will restore this service."

Parking charges are killing our High Streets

Barnet High Street has too many empty shops. Local jobs and businesses have been forced out. Meanwhile, income from parking charges in Tory-run Barnet rose by a staggering £1.3 million pounds - a 30% rise and the highest rise of any council in the country.

Focus team member Sean Hooker called on council chiefs to urgently review parking charges and help hard-pressed shoppers and businesses. Says Sean: "Our High Streets are dying because of extortionate charges

and over-zealous traffic wardens. We need to stimulate our local economy by allowing people to park for free for up to one hour. You can park for free at Brent Cross all day, but you have to pay to park to get a pint of milk in Barnet High Street."

Freeing up parking restrictions as part of a package of help for local traders and small businesses could make a real difference to our High Streets. Shopping locally is good for the environment too.

LDF fails to protect High Barnet

The LDF (Local Development Framework) is Barnet's new planning document that sets out what developers are allowed to do in the borough.

Focus team member Jonty Stern said. "The draft of the first part of this document is vague and full of platitudes but offers scant protection for High Barnet. We need a much stronger document that will allow the council to restrict developers to appropriate development and safeguard the greenbelt."

Danger! - Dog mess

Dog fouling is on the increase - according to a recent survey carried out by Barnet Lib Dems.

Says Cllr Duncan Macdonald:

'Dog mess on our streets and in our open spaces looks bad, smells bad and is dangerous. As a dog owner myself, I know that most dog owners in High Barnet are responsible people who clear up after their pets.

Unfortunately there are a number of so-called professional dog walkers and a minority of owners who are irresponsible.'

Adds Duncan: 'We have reported the results of our survey to the council but clearing up the mess *after* it's been left is only part of the solution. Up and down the country local councils have led *hard hitting* campaigns to reduce the amount of dog mess on their streets. At the next council meeting the Lib Dems will be calling on Barnet to investigate the most successful of these schemes and to copy the best ideas.'
